What support can Aviva offer?

All Aviva services are free. You do not need to enter a Safe House or to have left your relationship to access Aviva services.

Services are available in Christchurch, Selwyn, Ashburton, and North Canterbury.

Adults' Family Violence Services offers individual and/or group education to people who are experiencing or have experienced family violence.

Sexual Violence Services in partnership with START offers crisis support to adults 18 and above following either a recent or historical sexual assault.

Tamariki and Rangatahi Services offers individual and/or group education to children and young people who have witnessed or experienced family violence.

ReachOut offers individually tailored support for people using or at risk of using violence.

Seuga offers bilingual and culturally appropriate group family violence education to Pasifika people.

Whānau Resilience supports people to achieve long-term healing and recovery through a whānau centred approach.

Everyone deserves to feel safe. Aviva is available 24/7 to offer immediate access to advice, advocacy, and support to those living with family or sexual violence.

What is Family Violence?

Family violence is about using power and control over someone else. It doesn't always involve physical violence; it can include emotional, psychological, financial, sexual, and spiritual abuse.

What is Sexual Violence?

Sexual violence is any type of sexual contact or behaviour that a person does not willingly and explicitly agree to. It includes a wide range of behaviours, including rape, attempted rape, coerced sexual activity, sexual harassment, and threats.

The Effects of Violence

Experiencing violence can be traumatic and is associated with a number of emotional, physical, and behavioural impacts. These can be different for each person and change with time.

Violence can affect how a person feels about themselves and how safe they feel in the world. For children, it can cause them to struggle controlling their own anger or developing healthy relationships.

Access to support and education is essential to help people to overcome the enduring harms of violence and move on to a violence-free future.

Who does Aviva support?


